Love of wine, friends, food, and nature is essential to the Portuguese way of living, and the ritual of sharing a casual bottle wine with friends is just as important as opening something special from the cellar for big occasion. Alandra and Pé bring the relaxed Portuguese way of life to the America, ensuring that no matter the occasion, a great wine—the original RTD—is available.

Location & History

Portuguese Americans form a vibrant piece of the US wine drinking puzzle, inspiring their communities to enjoy food and wine together just as in Portugal, a tiny country with the top wine consumption per capita in all of Europe. In the 19th century, Portuguese communities established themselves in seafaring areas near New England, New Jersey, California, and even Hawaii. Many in these communities continued their family traditions by making wine at home. Now, in the 21st century, they've embraced wines that remind them most of their heritage at a price designed to share with friends. Enter: Alandra and Pé.

Winemaking Overview

Alandra and Pé wines are made to emphasize young, vibrant, traditional grape varieties, sourced from trusted farmers across multiple growing regions across Portugal. These are “wines of the vintage,” meant to be consumed young and with food. As such, these wines are produced completely in stainless steel to maintain their fresh character.

Agriculture & Sustainability

Alandra and Pé wines are both produced using lighter-weight glass bottles to reduce their carbon footprint. And, in the spirit of table wine always at the ready—but with a nod to sustainable innovation—the Alandra wines are offered in bag-in-box 3L format, which also dramatically reduces the emissions of the wine.
